TRAFFIC CALMING

Lisa has heard from many drivers of their frustration when attempting to join Jacklyns Lane from side roads like Elm Road and Spring Way. Traffic on Jacklyns Lane regularly exceeds the 30 mph limit along this stretch of road. The local police are aware and she hopes that they will be deploying speed cameras soon. The flashing sign encourages speed awareness and records the number of vehicles exceeding the limit - this will provide the Town Council with a clearer indication of where traffic calming may need to be introduced in the town

PAVING THE WAY

We are delighted that traffic and pedestrian access on The Soke has been added to the list of improvements to be funded by Hampshire County Council in 2013-14 - great news for all who live, drive and walk in that very narrow access. **New Alresford Councillor, Lisa Griffiths, says 'Having heard from residents how difficult it has been, I am pleased that work is finally going ahead here.**

CAR PARKING CHARGES FROZEN

The Conservatives are committed to providing a range of parking arrangements, balancing local convenience with environmental concerns. These include the half hour free parking street parking bay concession in the town centre, free Sunday and evening parking, which most neighbouring towns and cities charge for. We have frozen the cost of park and ride to ensure that this remains the best value and the greenest parking option for visitors to Winchester. They are also freezing rural area parking charges and season tickets.

Under review is how to improve the bus provision to meet increasing peak hour demand and also plans for a lower cost for those not using the bus; walkers, cyclists and car sharers.
